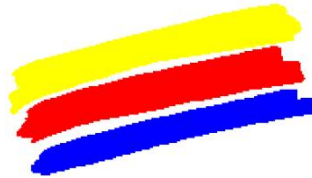

Dr. Colleran graduated from the University of Wisconsin Medical School and received her residency training in Internal Medicine and completed a fellowship in Endocrinology at the UNM School of Medicine. She is board certified in Internal Medicine and is an associate professor at the University of New Mexico Department of Medicine, Endocrinology Division. This department is currently using telemedicine to address risk factors for cardiovascular disease and improve prevention and treatment of diabetes in rural patients. It also assesses the applicability of telemedicine as a distance learning tool for residents, medical students, and physician assistant students participating in rural rotations.

Program Purpose

The purpose of the Diabetes Advisory Council quarterly meetings is to provide state-of-the-art information to diabetes care providers throughout the state of New Mexico.

- Discuss the ECHO model using case based learning
